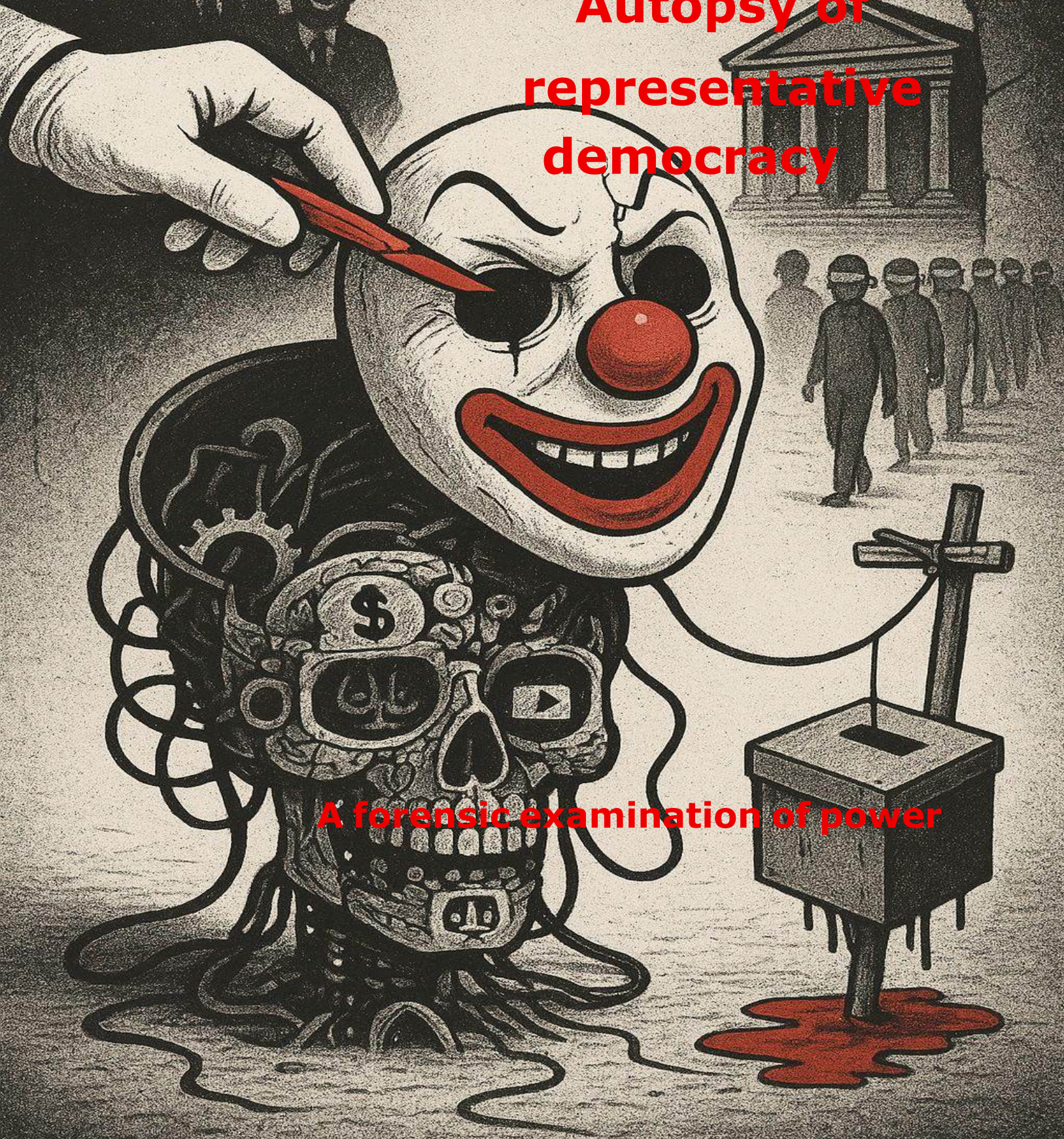

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Editorial Note: Why this book has no ISBN

This book does not carry an ISBN. Not out of forgetfulness, nor for lack of means — but **by deliberate choice**.

Today the ISBN is no longer a neutral tool. It is a **seal of approval from the global publishing system**, a passport to enter the commercial circuit controlled by a handful of multinationals, States, and agencies that decide what deserves to be seen, sold, catalogued... and what does not.
